Your exams count 55% of your grade, the final counts 25%, and your homework and quizzes count 20%.

Course content: The main topics that we will cover include the mathematics of management problems, codes, voting methods and apportionment, and probability.

Homework: You will receive a sheet assigning homework problems. They will be even-numbered problems for you to hand in for a grade on an assigned day. (The odd-numbered problem before or after the even-numbered problem may be similar, and you may check those answers in the back of the book.) Anything done or assigned in class may appear on a test, whether or not it was discussed or handed in. The goal is for you to have the knowledge to tackle many different kinds of problems on your own, not just ones you've seen before. If you have questions, it is your responsibility to ask them. Feel free to call me in my office, or ask me before, during, or after class. Getting together with other students to go over problems first may help.

Tests: There will be 4 tests and a comprehensive final. All exams are to be taken during the designated class time; there will be no early exams or makeups. One test grade (not the final) may be dropped.

A word about my "policy:" You are in competition only with yourself. I do not curve grades; your grade will be as good or as poor as you make it. Test questions are not necessarily ones you have seen before, but they will require only the skills you are supposed to know.

Attendance: An attendance sheet for you to sign will be passed around class each day. I reserve the right to withdraw a student after 5 absences. However, if you want to withdraw, you need to take the initiative. Do not assume that I will do it for you.

Avoid conflicts. Homework will not be accepted late. You may turn your paper in early, give it to another student to turn in to me, or bring the homework to my office **BEFORE 6:30 PM** on the day it is due.
