Grades: There will be four major tests, quizzes/homework and a 3-hour comprehensive final exam. The two lowest quiz/homework scores will be dropped, and the average of the remaining scores will count as a 5th test score. **NO** make-up quizzes will be given. Any missed major test can be made up only in the case of a documented emergency. Any student who misses a major test must contact the instructor **before** the next class meeting. The components will be weighed as follows:

4 major tests + quiz/homework average → 75%,
Final exam → 25%.

The standard grading scale will apply: 90 – 100 A, 80 – 89 B, 70 – 79 C, 60 – 69 D, and below 60 is an F. Note: An “88” is not an “A”.

Attendance: Attendance will be taken daily starting Friday, Aug. 22. A student with no more than 5 absences, **excused or unexcused**, may replace their lowest major test score with their final exam score. Students with more than 3 unexcused absences before midterm will be withdrawn from class.

Homework: Homework will be assigned daily, and it is essential that you do all reading and attempt all problems before the next class. When possible, we will spend some class time answering homework questions, but if time does not permit all questions being answered, it is the student’s responsibility to seek help outside of class. Homework is for **your** good and will not be collected, but quiz questions will be “clones” of problems assigned for homework.
