

Cumulative Final Exam: Scheduled by the student during Finals week.

*There are football games on these weekends; parking on campus after 5pm is challenging. Notice that there is no class on the dates 9/7, 10/30, and 11/23-11/27. We DO have class on 12/8 (Tuesday is a Friday that week). The last day to drop any course is October 22. The deadline to switch sections is September 16.

Tests may be made up in the event of University of Georgia athletics (arrangements made at least 72 hours on advance) or documented illness. It is the responsibility of the student to contact me as soon as possible and definitely before the next attended class meeting to make appropriate arrangements for making up any missed test. In order to make-up the final exam, documentation must be provided. There is no makeup of homework or quizzes; there are scores dropped instead.

Tests are taken outside of class time during the hours 9 a.m. - 10 p.m. **A picture ID is required to take each test.** Each student must go to the Math 1113 website to register for a time to take each test. The testing labs are located in Boyd Rooms 220 and 324. The lab supervisor is Phil Bergonio, pbergonio@math.uga.edu. Students will be able to register for specific testing times 2-4 days prior to the test date. Reminders will be posted on the course websites, as well as on the course page in Web Assign.

A note on grades: On any given semester an instructor will field at least one student by the end of the semester concerned about losing HOPE or not graduating. The responsibility always lies with the student. You should be in class every time. You should turn in every assignment. **If you have a question, ask it; someone else probably has the same question.** Take advantage of office hours – they are there for your benefit. If you are unhappy about a grade received or the explanation for an assignment ask immediately. Waiting will only hinder your understanding. The end of the semester is too late to begin fixing these problems.
