**Materials**: Text: Calculus, Early Transcendentals Version, UGA custom edition, Edwards & Penney Scientific Calculator no more powerful than a TI-86 (Memories will be checked before each test.) Note that the cell phone is not a mathematical tool, so all phones should be silenced and out of sight during both class time and recitation. No laptop computers should be open and in use during class.

**Grades**: There will be 4 major tests, in class quizzes, possibly some homework and a 3-hour comprehensive final exam. **NO** make-up quizzes will be given, but the two lowest quiz scores will be dropped. Any missed major test can be made up only in the case of a documented emergency. Any student who misses a major test must contact the instructor **before** the next class meeting. The components will be weighed as follows:

4 major tests → 60%,

Quizzes & homeworks → 15%

Final exam → 25%.

Grading scale: 92 – 100 A, 89 – 91 A-, 87 – 88 B+, 82 – 86 B, 79 – 81 B-, 77 – 78 C+, 69 – 71 C-, 60 – 68 D, and below 60 F.

A student with no more than 4 absences, **excused or unexcused**, including recitation sessions, may replace their lowest test score with their final exam score. Students with more than 4 unexcused absences may be withdrawn from class with either a WP or a WF, depending on academic status in the course at that time.

**Homework:** There will be homework regularly assigned from the text. These will provide practice, but will not usually be graded. An occasional homework problem may be assigned to be turned in, but these will always be announced in advance.
